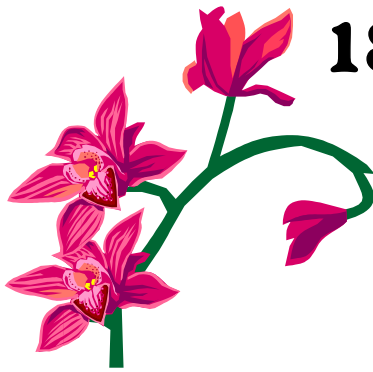

HOW TO ENTER PLANTS AT THE AOC CONFERENCE

1. The venue - The Leisure & Events Centre, Derrimut Rd, Hoppers Crossing, will be open between 9am - 5pm on Tuesday 8th Sept for you to bring along your entries.
2. Make sure you have your name neatly placed either on the **back** of the pot or on a ticket pushed down in the pot.
3. **Double check** your plants for aphids and other insects.
4. **Clean the pot** and tidy up the orchid, removing any dead leaves etc.
5. Your display plants can be picked up after we close at 3pm Sunday 13th Sept. If you do not want to pay to come in to retrieve your plants, you may arrive after 2pm when the members on the door entry will have finished duty.
6. Members who have volunteered their assistance, please wear your club name tag, you will be issued with a Volunteer identification when you come on duty. Please be on time as we are relying on you to be there.
