Next Meeting

Show Plant/Sales plant Ratio

Members are reminded that at the August
2009 Committee Meeting the Show Plant to
Sales Plant ratio was changed. The ratio is
now 1:8, i.e. for every 1 show plant that you
enter, you may present 8 plants for sale, to a
maximum of 50 on the first day (Saturday).
The Sales Coordinator and Show Coordinator
may at their discretion allow further sales
plants for Sunday.

A point of clarification, some members have
in fact asked for, and received, 100 sales
tickets, prior to the show (in anticipation of the
Sunday plants), this infers that they will enter
13 (can't have 12.5 plants) in the show.

Members please respect that we are putting
on a "**show**" for the public and our falling
show entries need bolstering. A decent show
(number of plants) is important to us all.

Can anyone help with this query?

If anyone has a response to this query, please get in touch with the writer, or send a reply to the Editor and we will print it next month (space permitting).

If you have a question you would like to ask, send it to the Editor and we may be able to make it a regular feature of the Bulletin.

Whilst re-potting my mother's cymbidium orchids I noticed that many pots had scrub worms, the potting mix had decomposed into soil and I suspect that this was what had attracted the worms and they must have further contributed to the composting.

I understand that as epiphytes grow on hosts, usually tree branches, this would not be the natural environment for worms; therefore I don't see what benefit epiphytes could derive from worms in the pot.

However, would the situation with terrestrials be different? Could the tunnels created by the worms in the soil be a conduit for the dissipation of nutrients and fungi that would contribute to the growth of the tubers?

I have done a rudimentary search of the literature and, although there is a lot on orchid pests and disease, there was nothing specific on the effect of worms on tubers,

Can any member shed light on the matter?

How to Fill in Cards for Benched Plants at our Monthly Meetings

Last month Eric's article "**Our Plant Competition**" taught us 'How do I enter a plant in the monthly competition or show?' Now that we know how to correctly identify our plants, we need to be able to fill in that information on the benching cards supplied by the club each month.

A card needs to be filled in for each plant benched on meeting nights. If you don't fill out your card correctly, you may not receive the points to which you are entitled, and your plant may not be judged in its correct class.

Select the correct colour card for your level. If you don't know which level you should be entering, check with Eric at the Membership desk:

Novice:	GREEN
Advanced Novice:	PINK
Intermediate:	BLUE
Open:	YELLOW

1. On the back of the card, fill in your name.
2. Next fill in the date of the meeting.

2. Then the Class eg: Species Any Genera
