MARIBYRNONG WINTER SHOW 2010 July 10th & 11th

Our Winter Show is happening this weekend and we need all the plants we can get! If you haven't entered before – now is as good a time as any.

Sales tickets, entry forms and tickets, etc, for the Winter show can be picked up at the venue.

New members please note: you may exhibit as many orchids in flower as you want in the show, but they must have been grown and owned by you for a minimum of 6 months. Orchids that have been owned by you for a lesser time may be exhibited in the Non-competitive section.

At the Autumn and Winter show, members may also exhibit other plants, cacti, bromeliad, fern, etc. They too must have been grown and owned by you for a minimum of 6 months. Awards for plants other than orchids come under a single section, meaning it is not divided up into Open, Intermediate and Novice.

If any members would like to offer their help during the show it will be greatly appreciated. Please let Anthony know, and he will allocate you a designated duty. Those members who help all day are given a lunch voucher, in appreciation. Those helping with the set up should be there by 12.30pm.

Orchid entry times are from 1.30pm - 6.00pm. Entries after this time will not be accepted, unless prior arrangements are made.

Members are asked not to bring their plants into the hall on the set up day for shows until the tables and chairs have all been reorganised, or until the Show Coordinator declares it is safe to do so.

If you wish to sell plants at our shows you must exhibit on the show-bench - the ratio is 8 plants to one exhibit. Members selling plants at our shows may bring them in after 3.30pm on the Friday preceding the show.

The Show closes at 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Please Note: The Sales area closes at 3.30pm on Sunday to enable members in this area to start the clean up. You are therefore required to collect your unsold plants at 3.30pm. Sales tickets must be removed and checked off on your sales sheet before taking plants away.

The Show area stays open till 4pm. The show area is cleaned up after that time.

Frost Protection

Winter is well and truly here and July and August are our worst months for frost in Melbourne. Some ways to protect your plants from frost are:

- House your orchids under a hard roof if possible.
- Consider putting a tarp or other similar covering over the top of your structure if it is made of shadecloth.
- Add protection around the sides of your structure if it is usually open, shadecloth blinds for example.
- Move plants more into the centre of the shadehouse – away from the perimeter and not touching the sides or the roof.
- Ensure there is adequate air movement or even a little heat from a fan heater if it is extremely cold.
- If you have a small collection or very precious plants you could bring them inside overnight, or into a garage, but not into a heated room – the temperature difference could be detrimental to the plants.
